Afternoons with Ruth is book two in the Conversations Series. Each of these books explores the importance of literal or metaphoric mentors in the creative life, *Afternoons with Ruth* presents glimpses into Kate Jordahl's friendship and creative discussions with Ruth Bernhard. It includes eleven images by Kate that were inspired and influenced by Ruth's spirit and photography.

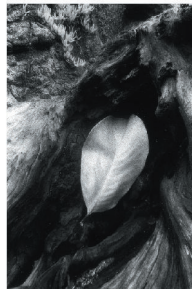
All three books in this series are bound as double-spined triptychs, an unusual structure that allows the content to change gradually. As pages are turned, new elements enter to amplify ideas or encourage re-interpretation.

Afternoons with Ruth contains eleven silver gelatin photographs printed by Kate Jordahl. The book is designed, hand bound and boxed by Don Drake, owner of Dreaming Mind. The letterpress printing is by Lisa Rappoport of Littoral Press. *Walking with Kandinsky* is a limited edition of 50 hand made books.
